


What is decision-making?

- selecting the best course of action.

Essential for leadership, management, and everyday life.


Types of decision-making

Routine, repetitive decisions.


Nonprogrammed decisions: Unique, nonroutine problems.

SWOT Analysis Cost-Benefit Analysis


Decision Matrix

Pareto Analysis Six Thinking Hats (Edward de Bono)


Improving decision-making
